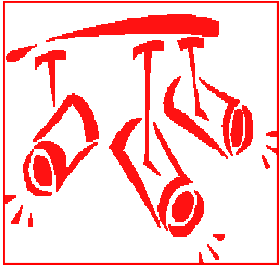




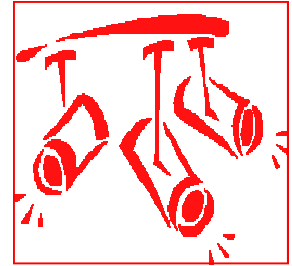

In order to participate in the program, all mentors must first complete forms; submit to a criminal/sex offender's/child abuse background check; undergo a mentor interview; and attend mandatory mentor orientation training. After this process has been completed, we ask all accepted mentors to commit to serve for at least one hour per week for one year.
