**Dr. Steven Rozman**

Dr. Rozman is a professor of political science and director of the Center for Civic Engagement and Social Responsibility at Tougaloo College, where he has been teaching since 1972. Dr. Rozman has also served as the Dean of Social Sciences and directed several externally funded faculty development projects at Tougaloo College. Dr. Rozman is the founder and co-director of the HBCU Faculty Development Network, a network of historically black colleges and universities that has an annual meeting to share teaching innovations and summer institutes on relevant topics. Dr. Rozman has had study/travel experiences in Asia, Africa, Europe, and Latin America and speaks both Spanish and Portuguese.

While serving as Professor of Political Science, Dr. Rozman has been instrumental in establishing service learning and community service within the curriculum of the college. Dr. Rozman received his BA degree from the University of Minnesota and his MA and PhD from the University of Florida. He is married to Jeanne Rozman.

The official ceremony will be held in February with a luncheon following. Please join me in congratulating these individuals.

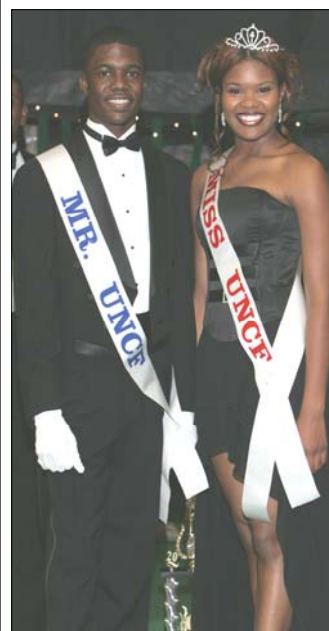
