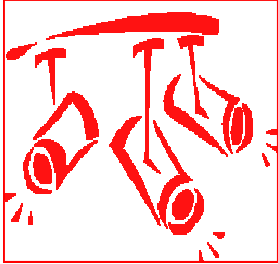




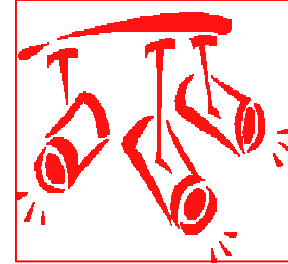

**Dr. Hakeem Oluseyi** is reaching new heights as an astrophysicist and professor of Physics at the University of Alabama in Huntsville. He is currently conducting research on the soft x-ray area of the sun's atmosphere. He has developed a special detector that he plans to send in a rocket to the sun, which will send back new information about that region of the sun's atmosphere. He is also collaborating with the Lawrence Berkeley National Laboratory in Berkeley, California on a project called the Supernova Acceleration Program (SNAP) mission. They plan to launch a space-based telescope in 2010. It will be able to observe thousands of supernovae a year.

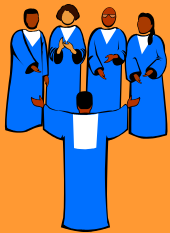

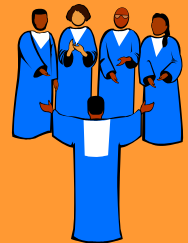
