Tougaloo College Places Three Students at Freedom Forum's Diversity Institute

Tougaloo, Miss. — Two graduating seniors (Crystal Daniel of Tylertown and Maha Mohamed of Brandon), as well as one junior (Terrance Mallory of Minneapolis, MN) will participate in The Freedom Forum's Diversity Institute. The Freedom Forum's Diversity Institute has selected the trio of Mass Communication students as Multimedia Scholars. They will join other scholars from historically black colleges and universities (HBCUs) from across the country for a two-week, college level course in multimedia in Nashville. Upon graduation this summer, they will be placed in eight-week, paid, multimedia internships at newspapers owned by Schurz Communications.

“We are so proud of these students,” says Tougaloo College President Beverly W. Hogan. “It is a wonderful opportunity for these young people to extend their learning experience beyond the classroom.”
