### Critical Notes:

- Some students may be advised or required to pass developmental, pre-college, non-degree credit course based on their ACT score. Credits earned from developmental courses will not count toward hours required for graduation. \*\*
- Some students are required to take **MAT 103** in order to take higher MAT courses (MAT 104 and above). *Please consult with your advisor in regards to which MAT is needed for your degree program.*
- ENG 100, ENG 300 and MAT 091 are requirements for those students who demonstrate a need.
- Again, credits earned from developmental courses will not count toward hours required for graduation.
- Students must earn a grade of "C" or better in all required CORE general education courses.
- Students have the option to "test out" of modern languages at the elementary levels and earn credit toward graduation.
- Humanities and Social Science majors must choose either GEN 210 (The Secret of Life) or GEN 211 (Race, Gender & Medicine) to fulfill 3 of the 6 required hours of Interdisciplinary CORE courses.
- If a transfer student has completed Comprehensive Health AND two P.E. courses, he or she is not required to take GEN 150 (Total Wellness).
