

While the OHWC staff are unable to perform procedures related to the collection of evidence for the purposes of pursuing criminal prosecution, they can provide medical care including wound care, testing, and treatment for sexually transmitted infections, and referral and transportation to a Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner. Under Mississippi law, the tests and procedures at the hospitals are free of charge if treatment is sought within 120 hours of the assault. Evidence gathered in this examination is maintained by the hospital and is not provided to the police unless the individual reports the assault to the police. 



Sharing information with Non-Confidential Resources will result in a college response.
